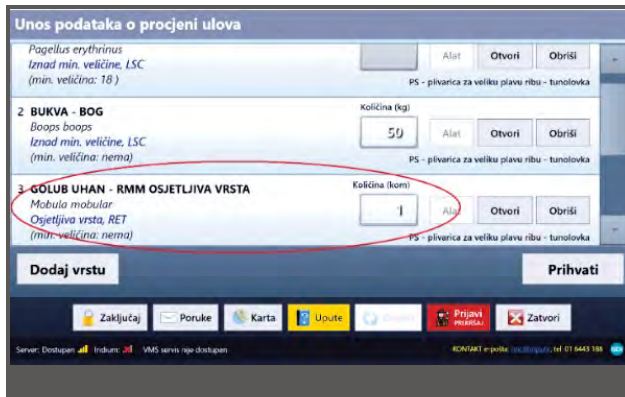


REPORT OF INCIDENTAL CATCH OF SENSITIVE SPECIES OF SEA TURTLES AND HANDLING OF CAUGHT INDIVIDUALS

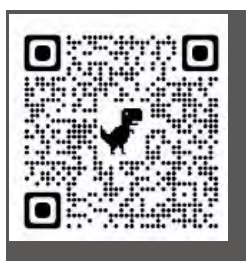


BE CAREFUL THAT THE ANIMAL DOES NOT BITE YOU OR INJURE YOU IN ANY OTHER WAY!



EVERY INCIDENTAL CATCH OF SEA TURTLES MUST BE REPORTED IN THE PRESCRIBED MANNER IN THE FRAMEWORK OF THE OBLIGATION OF CATCH REPORTING IN SEA FISHING!

In case of catching a **live** sea turtle: pick up the turtle and place it on the vessel. If the animal is uninjured, slowly lower it back into the sea.



In case of catching an **injured** sea turtle: pick up the turtle and place it on the vessel. Call 112 and follow the instructions.



In case of catching a sea turtle that looks like it has **died**: pick up the turtle, place it on the vessel and put it in a slightly inclined position (so that the head of the animal is extended and at a lower level than the rear end of the body). Call 112 and follow the instructions.

DO NOT cover the nostrils!

DO NOT turn the animal, keep it vertical or with its back facing down!

DO NOT keep the animal in water containers because animals can drown!

DO NOT pull a string, nylon or bag sticking out of the mouth or some other part of the body!

DO NOT pull the turtle by its flippers, head or tail!

DO NOT return the turtle into the sea while it is seemingly dead!
