
REPORT OF INCIDENTAL CATCH OF SENSITIVE SPECIES OF CARTILAGINOUS FISH AND HANDLING OF CAUGHT INDIVIDUALS

EVERY INCIDENTAL CATCH OF SENSITIVE
CARTILAGINOUS FISH SPECIES MUST BE
REPORTED IN THE PRESCRIBED MANNER IN THE
FRAMEWORK OF THE OBLIGATION OF CATCH
REPORTING IN SEA FISHING!

Additionally, report the finding through the Reporting System via the following form:



It is best not to bring the shark on board!



If the shark is in the sea: cut the nylon as close to the mouth as possible.



If the shark is on board: cut the hook or cut the nylon as close to the eye of the hook as possible. Return the shark to the sea, head first, do not throw it! Hold the shark by the pectoral fin with one hand and the tail with the other hand. Let the shark slide.

DO NOT pick up the shark by the tail or the head!

DO NOT cut the tissue (or the jaw in a ray) to remove the hook!

DO NOT cause additional injury!

DO NOT pick up the shark by the gills!

DO NOT put your hands in the shark's mouth to remove the hook!

DO NOT carry the shark by hooking a ship's hook or something sharp into its body, jaw or gills!

DO NOT expose the shark to the sun!
